



Open Frisco at a glance

UPDATED JUNE 29, 2020

On June 26, Governor Greg Abbott issued a revised Executive Order that slows his plan to 'Open Texas'. All essential businesses remain open under the operating guidelines previously provided by the [Texas Division of Emergency Management \(TDEM\)](#) and the [U.S. Department of Homeland Security](#). The following businesses, facilities and services are NOT OPEN or allowed at this time:

- **Bars** – All bars and similar establishments that receive more than 51% of their gross receipts from the sale of alcoholic beverages were required to close at 12 p.m. June 26, 2020. These businesses may remain open for delivery and take-out, including for alcoholic beverages, as authorized by the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission.
- **City of Frisco water park**
- **No visitors to nursing homes**

Effective June 29

- **Restaurants**
 - Capacity decreases from 75% to 50%
 - Table seating limited to 10

Effective June 26 50% capacity

- **Outdoor events: 100-person limit, unless approved by Mayor or County Judge**
- **Businesses may operate at 50% capacity**
- **Amusement parks**
- **Bowling alleys**
- **Driving schools**
- **Gyms**
- **Manufacturers**
- **Movie theaters**
- **Museums and libraries**
- **Performance halls**
- **Professional, collegiate or similar sports leagues**
- **Retailers**
- **Swimming pools**
- **Valet parking**
- **Video game facilities**
- **Water parks**
- **Wedding receptions and venues**

No occupancy limit*

- * May not exceed City of Frisco permitted occupancy
- * Must maintain 6 feet social distancing

- **Barber Shops**
- **Child-care services**
- **Churches and places of worship**
- **Cosmetology / Hair salons**
- **Essential businesses** (defined by U.S. Dept. of Homeland Security's Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA), version 3.1)
- **Government operations**, including municipal and county
- **Massage, personal care**
- **Nail salons**
- **Recreational sports programs for youth and adults**
 - **Adults**
 - **Youth**
- **Tanning salons**
- **Youth camps** – includes summer, daytime and overnight
 - **Daytime**
 - **Overnight**
 - **Summer**
